REQUIRED FOUNDATIONAL SKILLS - You must demonstrate a minimum level of achievement, either by successful testing or satisfactory course completion (a grade of "C" or better) in four areas:	
1. Writing	English 085, 089, 091, or 114
2. Reading	Reading 040A or 040C
3. Math	Math 050 or 107 (or complete higher level course)
4. Computers	CIS 100 or any other CIS course. (CIS 110 or 120A or 129 are strongly recommended.)
<p>Placement Tests are required –Testing Services is in Room 134 – Call 777-0394 for an appointment. English and Reading placement tests may be waived if you show documentation of a proficiency level 1 or 2 on the high school MEAP or MME writing and reading tests or if you have an ACT composite score of 22 or greater. The Mathematics placement test may be waived if you show documentation of a score of 28 or above on the ACT Math test.</p>
