Iyana Brown Named First Team All-American; Third in MCC Women's Basketball History

Muskegon Community College women's basketball guard Iyana Brown was named a National Junior College Athletic Associations (NJCAA) Division II First Team All-American for the 2019-20 season.

She becomes only the third MCC women's basketball player to earn NJCAA First Team All-American honors, joining Darcell Williams (2007-08) and Angie Bond (1991-92).

The five-foot, 10-inch sophomore paced the MCC squad to the Michigan Community College Athletic Association (MCCAA) Western Conference title, a 25-5 overall record, and runner-up finishes in a both the state championship and the NJCAA Great Lakes Western Regional championship contests.

A graduate of Fruitport High School, Brown led the Jayhawks in points scored (16.5), rebounds (10.6), assists (4.3), steals (3.2) and blocks (2.5). She was voted the MCCAA Western Conference Player of the Year

The Muskegon Community College Women’s Basketball team lost in the NJCAA Region XII Finals to Mid Michigan College, 71-58.

MCC got off to a slow start and that affected the game from start to finish. Mid Michigan led after the first quarter, 19-11. In the second quarter, the Jayhawks were more disciplined on both ends of the floor and they were able to get some stops on defense. They outscored the Lakers 20-15, but the Lakers still held a slim 3-point lead at the half, 31-34. The third quarter was a repeat of the first, with MCC struggling to find the right shot and Mid Michigan playing with energy. At the end of the third quarter it was 50-38 and Mid Michigan would roll to win.

Sophomore Yasmine Colon (Hart HS) led the Jayhawks with 21 points and Freshman Kacy Jeffries (Whitehall HS) contributed 12 points. Sophomore Iyana Brown (Fruitport HS) finished with 13 rebounds and 9 points and Sophomore Tierra Williams (Muskegon HS) grabbed 11 boards.

“We just didn’t play our best game tonight,” said Head Coach Jason Cooper. “After tonight we will look back at the great season we had, I’m very proud of my team.”

The Muskegon Community College Women's Basketball Team defeated Grand Rapids Community College in the semi-final round of the NJCAA Region XII Tournament, 74-50.

In the first quarter, GRCC was able to use their height advantage to rebound, but MCC was able to grab a 21-10 lead. In the second quarter the Raiders used the 3-point shot to outscore MCC and the Jayhawks took a 37-31 lead into the locker room at the half. MCC started to pull away in the third quarter as they used their defensive intensity to create fast break opportunities and a 54-42 lead. MCC totaled 19 steals for the game, many of them leading to easy baskets, and GRCC really wasn't able to pull any closer.

Yasmine Colon (Hart HS) led the Jayhawks with 18 points, 9 rebounds, and 5 steals. Iyana Brown (Fruitport HS) finished with 17 points, 6 rebounds, and 4 steals and Joy Lee (Byron Center HS) added 12 points. Tierra Williams (Muskegon HS) was also in double digits in scoring with 10 points and 8 rebounds.

"What a great win today," said Head Coach Jason Cooper. "We came together as a team to put together a solid performance."

The Jayhawks are now 25-4 on the season and they will play Mid Michigan College on Saturday, 3/7 at noon in the Championship Game at GRCC.

Muskegon Community College hosted the Women's Michigan Community College Athletic Association State Championship, which pitted the Western Conference Champion, Muskegon Community College against the Eastern Conference Champion, Macomb Community College. Macomb came into the game ranked 3rd in the latest national polls, while the Jayhawks were ranked 19th. In the end, the Monarchs had a little too much firepower as they defeated the Jayhawks 79-65.

Both teams played with intensity from the opening tip with Macomb grabbing a 19-16 lead after the first quarter and maintaining the 3-point advantage 38-35 at half time. In the third quarter, the Jayhawks struggled to score in the paint, but Macomb racked up the fouls to keep Muskegon close at 56-51. In the fourth quarter Macomb pulled away for the final margin of victory.

Iyana Brown (Fruitport HS) led the Jayhawks with 15 points and 16 rebounds. Yasmine Colon (Hart HS) contributed 14 points and 8 rebounds and Tanae Hamer (Hudsonville HS) finished with 13 points. Kacy Jeffries (Whitehall HS) closed out the double-digit scorers with 11.

“We played against a great team today and we had our chances, but we have to play well the full forty minutes against a team like Macomb,” said Head Coach Jason Cooper. “I’m very proud of my team; we will take what we learned today into regionals.”
