In the first quarter Parkland led 15-11. MCC's women fought back in the second quarter to take a one-point lead into the locker room at the half, 25-24. In the third quarter the Cobras came out strong, scoring 15 while limiting the Jayhawks to only 8 points for a 39-33 lead. The Jayhawks struggled to score in the fourth quarter and the Cobras capitalized on their opportunities. In the fourth the Jayhawks scored only 4 points, the Cobras adding 19 to their total. Tanae Hamer (Hudsonville HS) led the Jayhawks with 16 points. Nia Miskel (Muskegon HS) had 6 points and 11 rebounds.

The Jayhawks will now play in the consolation bracket on Wednesday, 4/21 against Kansas City Kansas Community College at 4:00 pm.

The Muskegon Community College Women's basketball team qualified to compete in the NJCAA National Tournament with a 72-54 victory over Delta College.

MCC was facing Delta for the third time this season, and just like the other games the Pioneers pressured the Jayhawks from the opening tip. MCC was able to break the press and finish at the rim for a 17-7 lead after the first quarter. In the second quarter MCC continued to handle the press and utilized a 1-2-2 defense to prevent Delta from scoring from the 3-point line. The half time score was 40-16. Delta was able to get the offense going in the third quarter as they outscored MCC 22-13 to cut into the Jayhawk lead, but MCC was still up 53-38 going into the fourth quarter and they were able to hold on for the victory.

Kacy Jeffries (Whitehall HS) led the Jayhawks with 17 points. Nia Miskel (Muskegon HS) scored 15 points and Tanae Hamer (Hudsonville HS) contributed 14 points. Point guard Julia Tierman (Mona Shores HS) was also in double digits with 12 points.

The Muskegon Community College Women's Basketball Team is the sole champion of the MCCA Western Conference after defeating the Grand Rapids Community College Raiders 55-53 in the last game of conference play.

The Raiders jumped out to an early lead and the Jayhawks struggled to play to their capabilities, with the Raiders holding a 22-10 lead after the first quarter. In the second quarter the Jayhawks were able to hold GRCC to only 8 points, while scoring 13, but they were still down 30-23 at half time. The third quarter was more of the same as the Jayhawks missed easy layups and struggled to rebound. GRCC held a 46-35 advantage heading into the fourth quarter. MCC played locked down defense to hold the Raiders to 7 points. Finally, with 1:19 left on the clock, the Jayhawks tied the game on two free throws from Sophomore Mariah Pringle, then with 33 seconds remaining Pringle was fouled on an inbounds play with two more free throws. GRCC attempted a last second shot that was no good, and the Jayhawks prevailed.

"What a fantastic team win tonight," said Head Coach Jason Cooper. "I'm proud of the perseverance and determined attitude that was displayed late in the game".

Pringle (Brethren HS) led the Jayhawks with 19 points and 13 rebounds. Nia Miskel (Muskegon HS) followed with 14 points and 11 rebounds. Tanae Hamer (Hudsonville HS) and Julia Tierman (Mona Shores HS) each contributed 11 points.

The Jayhawks are 12-2 overall and 8-0 in conference play. The team's next game will be on Thursday April 8th when they host the winner of Metro League #4 and North League #3. The regional tournament game will be in Bartels-Rode Gymnasium at 7:00 pm.
