PART 2 AUDITION/INTERVIEW

The Muskegon Community College Theater Department gives recognition to students who are exceptionally productive and talented actors or theater technicians. All applicants are required to audition and/or interview for the PBS scholarship. See requirements below.

Acting Requirements:

- Present two contrasting memorized monologues. Each a minimum of 1 minute in length.
- Prepare a printed listing of your performance experience.
- Write, print, and bring with you a one page reflection on why you want to study theater.

Technical Theater Requirements:

- Prepare a printed listing of your technical theater experience. Include your skills and special training related to theatrical production.
- Bring all examples of your work in technical theater.
- Write, print, and bring with you a one page reflection on why you want to study theater.

AUDITION/INTERVIEW STEPS:

1. Complete the PBS application process and send application, recommendation letter, and transcript to the Director of the Center for Theater, 221 S. Quarterline Road, Muskegon, MI 49442 or hand deliver to the Arts & Humanities Department, room 166 on the MCC campus.

If you are awarded a scholarship you must meet the following criteria to retain your scholarship:

- Successfully complete a minimum of 6 college credit hours in both fall and winter semesters
- Successfully complete a minimum of two classroom theater courses during the school year
- Maintain a minimum of 2.0 GPA overall in your course(s) at MCC
- Perform in or work crew for a minimum of 1 Center for Theater production in both fall and winter semesters
- Participate in recruiting events held by the Center for Theater
- Complete a yearly review of your participation in the theater department with the Director of the Center for Theater
