STAR GUARD AIDED IN WINNING MAJOR PORTION OF GAMES

Elected at Annual Banquet
Tendered Members of
Basketball Squad

Clarence Rohwedder, star guard of the Muskegon Junior College basketball team, was elected by letter winners of the school's quintet to the post of captain for the 1928-29 season, at the annual cage banquet of the college held at Cottage Inn, last night.
Rohwedder has been an important cog in the Jaysee machine, and his guarding, together with the shooting ability of his teammates, Captain McDonald, Hathaway, Hohenstein and Lambert, has aided in improving the record of the two years of competition for his school. During the past season the Jaysees lost just four games, two of them to teams rated much stronger than a junior college aggregation should be. The two were the Muskegon Y, and Ferris Institute teams. The other two losses were to the Grand Rapids Junior College squad, which was undefeated in state league play.
The annual banquet was voted a real success by the players of the college. A. E. McCrea, managing editor of The Chronicle, was the principal speaker. D. R. Henry, director of the college, was toastmaster. Coach M. R. Ewing, captain Norman McDonald and captain-elect Rohwedder were also called on for remarks.
