The Jayhawk Volleyball Team traveled to Wisconsin for the Battle of the Dells Tournament on Friday and Saturday, Aug 23 & 24 in Wisconsin Dells, Wisc. The tournament featured many of the top teams in the Nation for NJCAA for DI, DII, and DIII. Muskegon played four teams that were ranked in the top 17, but unfortunately came away on the wrong end of each match and struggled to a 0-4 record.
