Kelly went 5.1 innings, allowing 4 earned runs on 5 hits with 3 strikeouts. MCC outhit the Raiders 16-7. Ryan Fields (Grand Rapids Catholic Central HS) was 3-4 with 2 RBI, Nate Bonter (Grand Haven HS) was 3-5 with 3 RBI, Ryan Beadle (Portage Northern HS) was 2-4 with a double and Jacob Sposaro (Kenowa Hills HS) was 2-3 with 3 runs scored.
