Ellie Adams Becomes MCC's First Women's Soccer All-American



Ellie Adams has become Muskegon Community

College's first women's soccer All-American after being named to the 2020-21 National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) Division II Women's Soccer All-America Second Team.

Adams, a 5-10 sophomore from Middleville, MI, played midfield for the MCC squad which tied for fifth in the nation at the NJCAA Div. II championships this spring. A graduate of Thornapple-Kellogg High School, she scored three goals and added eight assists for the Jayhawks.

"Since she arrived in our program as a freshman, she's been a difference maker," said MCC Head Coach Jeff Lohman, whose team posted a 9-3-1 record this year. "Ellie's soccer IQ and vision of the field are strong and allowed her to be an integral part of our team's successful back-to-back Region 12 championships."

Adams has signed to continue her collegiate soccer career this fall at NCAA Division II Tiffin University in Ohio.

Neither team could find the back of the net in two overtimes, sending the game to a penalty kick shootout. Bolles, Hecht, Ellie Adams (Thornapple Kellogg HS) and Alexa Musk (Mona Shores HS) all converted their kicks. Rachel Wienclaw (Buckley HS) made and impressive save to secure the win.

The Jayhawks finished the season with a fine 9-3-1 record - their only losses coming from Division III National Champion Delta College and top ranked Phoenix College.
