A very successful 2021-2022 season came to an end for the Jayhawk Women's Basketball team with a 60-52 loss at the hands of North Central Missouri College in the consolation game at the NJCAA National Championship.

The Jayhawks jumped out to a 14-10 lead after the first quarter, but cold shooting in the second quarter saw MCC score only 6 to NCM's 16 for a 26-20 deficit at half time. MCC came out quick in the third quarter and grabbed a lead but NCM responded with another run and the Jayhawks would never recover.

"I'm very proud of this team," said Head Coach Jason Cooper. "I'm sure we will reflect on our great season after the sting goes away from this loss".

Julia Tierman (Mona Shores) gave a gutsy final performance with 15 points, 4 assists and 4 rebounds. Karleigh Jeffries (Whitehall) added 10 points, Mariah Pringle (Brethren) had 9 points, 7 rebounds and 3 assists and Calla Miller (Fremont) scored 9 points and grabbed 10 rebounds. Trina Lewis (Reeths-Puffer) shared the team rebound lead with 10.

MCC finished the season with a fine 25-6 record.

MCC and ICC battled to a 14-14 tie after the first quarter and the second quarter was just as competitive, with MCC claiming a 1 point lead at the half, 32-31. The Jayhawks came out of the locker room and outscored the Cougars 19-14 and they continued to pull away in the fourth for the final margin of victory.

"It was a great win today," said Coach Cooper after the game. "This is a big win for our girls and Muskegon Community College!"

All five starters scored in double digits for MCC with Freshman Calla Miller (Fremont) leading the way with 18 points, 6 rebounds and 2 steals.
