

Associate in Applied Science in Instructional Assistant, Special Education 2021-22 catalog years

Four-year plan for part time students

Description: This degree is intended to prepare students to work as a paraprofessional or instructional assistant directly in a special needs environment. A paraprofessional will work directly under a certified teacher in a Pre-K to 12th grade classroom. Duties may include the assisting in the implementation of an Individualized Education Plan (IEP), assessment, observations, use of technology and personalized curriculum. Students must communicate effectively with parents, students, service teams and teachers. The degree is not designed to transfer to another program but is to go directly to the workforce.

Career Opportunities: A wide variety of potential jobs with the associate degree only may include classroom assistant, classroom aide, and paraprofessional in a K-12 school district under a certified special education teacher. Salary ranges include \$16,000 for classroom assistant or aide, \$20,000 for paraprofessional.

Transfer paths and requirements: This program is not designed for students wishing to transfer to a four-year college for a bachelor's degree. Students planning to transfer should consult with an MCC counselor.
